## What are DSST Exams?

DSST (DANTES Subject Standardized Tests) provide an opportunity for people to obtain college credit for what they have learned in non-traditional ways. The DSST Program is made available by The Chauncey Group International and is used by adult education programs, the United States Department of Defense, two, and four-year colleges.

DSST Exams are a series of computer-based examinations with a 2-hour time limit. You can choose from over 30 exams. A brief description is provided for each exam in the attached brochure.

## What you should do before taking a DSST Exam:

Enclosed is a list of the DSST exams, scores and course equivalents for Cal U.

You should speak with your academic advisor prior to taking an exam to ensure that the exam is accepted for your program of study.

Thirty (30) credits is the maximum a student can earn through DSST and/or CLEP.

## Cost and Registration

Cost per exam is \$85 payable only by credit card (MasterCard, Visa, American Express).

- One (1) form of government-issued photo ID including signature (Driver's License, Passport or Military ID).
- Payment by credit card only (MasterCard, Visa, American Express).
- \*Institutional Score Report Recipient Code-If you are not a Cal U student please see the Institutional Score Report Code section below.

## \*Institutional Score Report Code

If you want to send your score report to an institution other than Cal U, you must obtain your Institutional Score Report Recipient Code prior to your test date. You can obtain this code at [http://getcollegecredit.com/participating\\_institutions.html](http://getcollegecredit.com/participating_institutions.html). If your institution is not listed, you must contact Thomson Prometric at (866) 794-3497 to obtain a code prior to your test date.

## Life Experience Fee

Once you pass an exam, you will receive an email with a link to pay the Life Experience Fee. This fee of \$25 is a one-time fee to be paid to the University to have the credits placed onto your transcript. You may pay by credit card or electronic check.
